

Information Sheet for Student Exchange Program

The Student Exchange Program allows students from SWU's partner university to study at SWU for one or two semesters. The credits earned at SWU can be transferred to the student's home institution.

Quick Facts about SWU

- Established in 1961, Christian (Presbyterian) Denominational.
- Student population of about 8,000 undergraduates.

Nominations

- Students should be selected by the home institution based on SWU's admission requirement.
- **Outgoing coordinators will provide the list of nominated students to the incoming coordinator at SWU.**

Eligibility

Students need to meet ALL of the following requirements to be eligible to apply

- Students should be a full-time student of SWU's partner university.
 - Need to be nominated by the international office of home institution.
 - Need to be able to take courses either in Korean or in English.
- * Even if a nominated student meet all of these requirements, he/she would not be able to enroll if your visa application is rejected by local Korean consulate.

Visa

- Students should get a student visa (D-2) from the nearest Korean consulate, with the Certificate of Acceptance issued by Seoul Women's University.
- The Certificate of Acceptance will be issued after accepting the original documents of application.

Medical Insurance

- All incoming international students are obligated to possess medical insurance plan that covers medical expenses to be incurred during the stay in Korea. Seoul Women's University accepts following plans:
 - National Health Insurance(Mandatory)
 - International medical insurance plan that is applicable in South Korea (proof must be provided)
 - Foreigner Student Insurance Plan (can be purchased through the SWU International Affairs Team)

[Important] Notice of Changes

Important notice regarding COVID-19

- Student exchange program at SWU and the visa policy of Republic of Korea is subject to change depending on how COVID-19 is evolving and affecting us. Please be prepared for changes.
- Students who already have submitted applications in the previous semesters are exempt from submitting application documents, except for Official English Transcripts of all college work to date, Official Certificate of Enrollment, Dormitory application.
- Please note that there will be an additional documents or information might be requested depending on the situation. Students should follow the COVID-19 prevention measures in accordance with the guidelines of the KCDC(Korea Centers for Disease Control and Prevention) and Seoul Women's University.

- **Until now, there are no plans to operate a quarantine facility on the Seoul Women's University campus in the fall semester of 2021. Therefore, we will only accept students who could afford a self-quarantine place outside the campus after entering Korea. Student can be move in on-campus dormitory after the quarantine periods is over.**
- Since the dormitory entry schedule and residential policy have not been decided yet, related information will be provided later.
- Information on academic schedule and classes will be decided and announced at the middle of the year 2021 or later. We will keep you updated on this.

Medical Insurance

- It is mandatory for international students (D-2, D-4) staying in Korea to subscribe to the National Health Insurance.
- The insurance fee must be paid by monthly
- Health insurance benefit is available only when health contribution is paid. Visa extension is restricted if you pay in arrears.

Courses

- The course schedule of international students would be any combination of the following categories:
 - Major and General Education Courses in Korean
 - Major and General Education Courses in English: There are roughly 20-30 Courses taught in English in General Education and across the majors.
 - Korean Language Program

International students may choose to take Korean Language Center (KLC) Courses free of charge.

KLC has an intensive program where you may take heavy load of Korean language course (**120 hours** per semester), as well as general education courses that will give you a brief introduction to Korean language.

Course Registration

- A student should take a minimum of 10 credits and a maximum of 18 credits per semester while enrolled in Seoul Women's University.
- Course Registration schedule

Fall Semester	Late June - Early July	Late July

- The list of courses that open for each semester will be provided at the time of course registration. Please refer to the list of classes of the previous academic year.
- Once all the classes are filled up, you will no longer be able to register as there are limited seats per class. Therefore, avoid registering for the same courses with many international students. (The only exception is Korean Language Courses)
- If you wish to register for Korean Language Course, you **MUST** take a placement test at SWU.
- The first week of class is the Add/Drop period in which you can add or drop the courses. Specific steps and the period will be announced during the orientation for international students. You should keep in mind that you may not be able to register for some classes as there are limited seats and there are some courses that you cannot drop.

Issuance of Official Transcript

- An Official Transcript will be mailed to the International Affairs Team of students' home university after the entire exchange period has ended.

Airport Pick-up

- We have no plan to airport pick-up yet due to COVID-19

Dormitory and Housing

- International Residence Hall provides foreign students with basic residence environment as well as facilities necessary for living so that students can focus on their studies. Students from different nationalities reside in International Residence Hall, so it is a great opportunity to learn each other's culture and how to live harmoniously. Female exchange or undergraduate students of SWU live in International Residence Hall, but need to move to Shalom House during breaks.
- Depending on the country of the exchange student's home institution, SWU may provide a 30% discount for the on-campus dormitory for the regular semesters. This scholarship is in principle for the students from the third world countries.

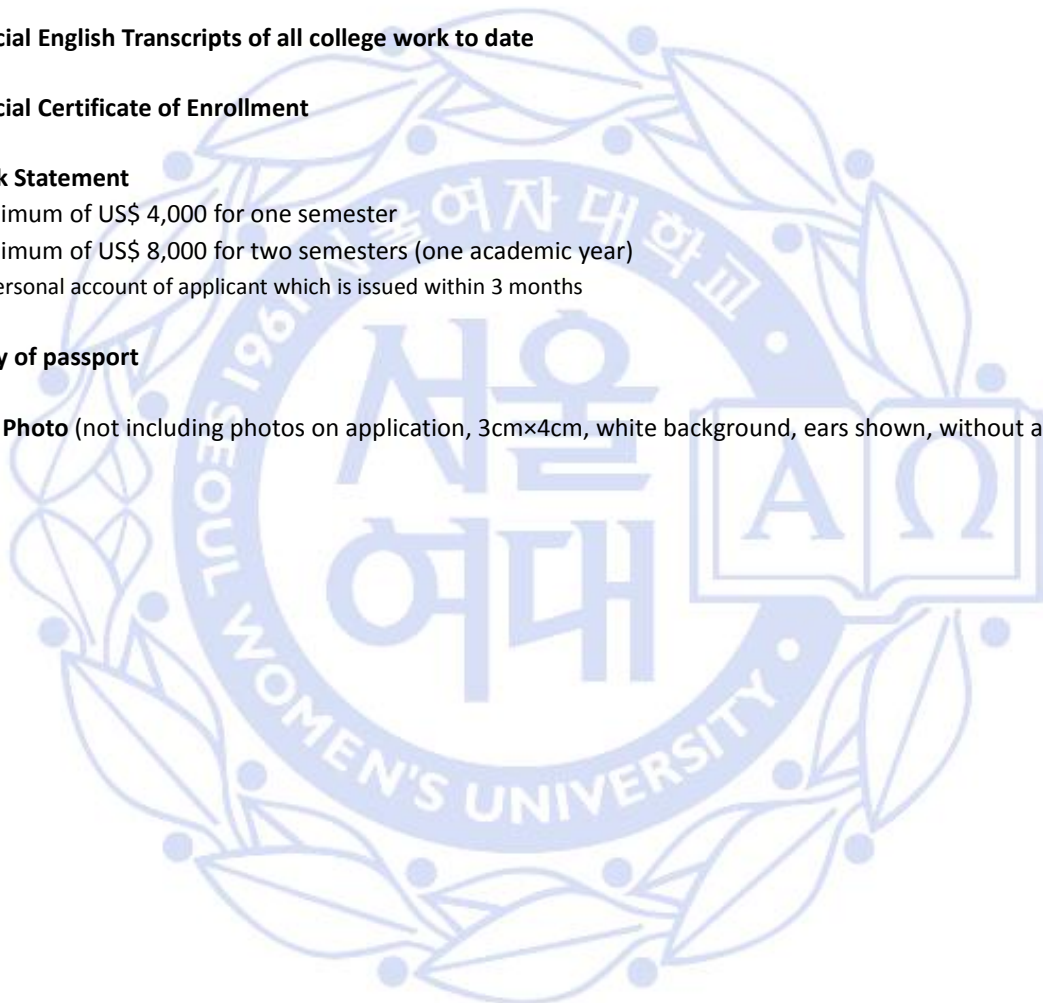
3) Official Certificate of Enrollment

6) 1 ID Photo (not including photos on application, 3cm×4cm, white background, ears shown, without a hat)

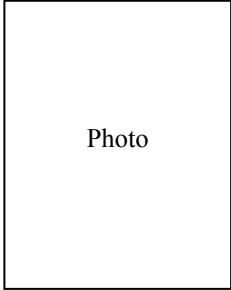
